#1 WHEN SHOULD I SPAY?



Dogs should be at least 6 months of age before we consider them a good candidate for spay.

Have a large breed dog? Talk to one of our doctors about why we might want to wait a little longer to spay.

Has your dog recently gone through a heat? If so, we recommend waiting 30-80 days after heat to give the uterus time to recover.

Before the

procedure

- DO allow 10-15 minutes for a technician to review the consent form
- DO NOT feed anything after 10 pm the night before the procedure
- DO NOT withhold water overnight
- DO plan on picking up the day of the procedure between 4:30-6 pm
- DO allow 10-15 minutes for a technician to review the discharge instructions
- DO NOT allow your pup to lick at their incision!
